In Madison County, Skyline CAP operates two Head Start classrooms to promote school readiness for 3- and 4-year-old children and support overall family well-being, and its Healthy Families program works with new and expectant families, providing home-based family support and coaching services to help them meet the challenges of parenting and create stable, nurturing environments for their children. The agency also works with middle and high school students through Project Discovery, a post-secondary education and career readiness program that encourages students to graduate from high school and provides resources to help them achieve success. In addition, Skyline CAP owns and maintains a total of 10 affordable housing units in Madison and provides housing counseling services, rental assistance, and emergency home repair to the county's low-income residents.
